### **Private Managed Forest Land Council finds Port Alberni owner did not meet reforestation requirements**

The Private Managed Forest Land Council (Council) has determined that Denis Francoeur Backhoeing Ltd., owner of MF 281 near Port Alberni, contravened section 31 of the Private Managed Forest Land Council Regulation 2007 (the regulation) by failing to ensure that a portion of a cutblock harvested in 2002 was adequately restocked.

In August 2009 a routine inspection of MF 281 identified potential reforestation issues. The Council initiated an investigation and retained an expert to carry out a stocking survey. The Executive Director prepared an Investigation Report which alleged that the owner had failed to restock the area harvested in 2002 in accordance with section 31 of the regulation.

Section 31 of the regulation requires the owner of private managed forest land to restock harvested areas within 5 years with at least the minimum number of crop trees well distributed across the harvested area. The stocking survey indicated that some portions of the 17.3 ha cutblock were adequately stocked but that approximately 13.5 ha had only 87% of the minimum requirements. The Council imposed a \$1 000 administrative fine and ordered that the area be restocked and surveyed by Spring 2011.

The Council is an independent provincial agency established in 2004 under the *Private Managed Forest Land Act* to administer the Managed Forest Program and protect key public environmental values on private Managed Forest land in British Columbia. The mandate of the Council is to encourage forest management practices on private managed forest land, taking into account the social, environmental and economic benefits of those practices including regulating forest practices relating to soil conservation, reforestation, and the protection of water quality and fish habitat.
